Meeting opened: 7:08pm

- **1.0** Lachlan Dale thanked everyone for coming to the meeting and that the meeting was about the roll out of the Junior League, the strategic change for the Under 15's. The Rational for the U15's to move to a charter model is significant and a report from the ABF with all states involved in the research, showed that there was a problem with the dropout in this age group.
 - 1.1 Numbers in WA shows that there was a 48% increase in the Little League area, only a 2% increase in the U15's and a 4% increase in the U17's age group. Colts (U21's) is a point for discussion and a core issue that needs to be solved. The goal is to increase numbers in the game, that it's fun and has an elite structure. The ABF will move into the charter model in the next year. It is envisaged that the under 17's will move into the Charter model down the track.
 - **1.2** Feedback from the ABF report is to play more games, have more tournaments and kids to play with friends and the enjoyment of the game. National participation is around 41,000 playing baseball across the country and is rated 17th against other sports.
 - **1.3** Base on all information received nationally and the BWA Board, we have extended the charter model into the Under 15's age group and how to implement the model into U15's baseball. The rational is that this would help the lack of participation rolling over to U15's and to senior baseball.
- 2.0 David Hayes The under 15's will now be known as Junior League. The purpose of this meeting is not to go into the nitty gritty of regulations etc., but to talk about the structure of the charter model. Development needs to be done with the eight charters and give delegates information tonight to take back to clubs. David will email out proposed regulations and information for clubs to talk about in the next meeting.

2.2.1 Junior League Notes:

- Charters may play in another charters competition
- Dispensations for players available to play out of age group.
- Regular Season does not have to be played on a Saturday. Charter can decide on day and time.
- Junior League 80 is played on an 80-foot diamond and 70 on a 70-foot diamond.
- The All Star Competition (looking for a new title) replaces the 15.1's competition and for players to play at a higher competitive level.
- Junior League Championships date to be revised as it is not to clash with the National Youth Championship.
- Fee Structure to be revised.

2.2.2 Junior League All Star (JLASL) Notes:

- Any Club can enter the competition
- Number of team players are not limited everyone can play
- Games are 90 minutes and proposed to have a Double Header on Sundays every second week. Reason for this is that parents do not have to commit to every week. 4 teams at one venue each week – negotiable.
- Format of JLASL is negotiable, delegates to speak to clubs and bring to the next meeting.
- Rod Bacon, LL Club Operations Administrator will do the fixtures.
